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## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

### Welcome Back

We have just submitted our annual enrolment census and I am happy to share with the school community that we have an increased enrolment for 2014 with 40 more students than last year choosing to study at our school. ### Communication with home

### JAPAN TRIP

Elanora SHS plans to have a trip to Japan in the September holidays. The students will fly to Osaka and visit Universal Studios, Kyoto, Hiroshima, Miyajima, Tokyo including a visit to Disneyland and then onto our school visit and homestay at Yokosuka Sogo High School. While at Yokosuka the students will have a day trip to Hakone. From the homestay we travel to Yokohama to leave, returning home on 4<sup>th</sup> October. ### KOKODA

Once again we are looking at entering some teams in the Kokoda Challenge (Jim Stillman Cup) which is held 19 & 20<sup>th</sup> July. It is a gruelling 48km trek. What is different this year is that participating teachers will not be involved in fund raising. 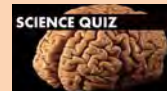

### ALL PARENTS / CARERS

Please follow the link <http://www.humanservices.gov.au/customer/services/medicare/child-dental-benefits-schedule> to find if your children are eligible for Dental Benefits in 2014. If they are you may need to start getting appointments organised as you don't want to miss out by leaving it too late.

Eligibility basics: children aged between 2 – 17 years, eligible for Medicare Benefits for dental services capped at \$1,000 per child over 2 consecutive calendar years.

If you do not use all of your \$1,000 benefit in the first year of eligibility, you can use it in the second year if you are still eligible. Any remaining balance will not be carried forward at the end of the second year.

Benefits will cover a range of services including examinations, x-rays, cleaning, fissure sealing, fillings, root canals and extractions.
