Your first day at secondary school will be one you will always remember so follow these steps to make it a success!

## YOUR FIRST DAY

### The night before:

- Have your bag packed.
- Have your named uniform laid out and ready.
- Check that you know how you are getting to school and who you are travelling with.
- Set your alarm to allow you plenty of time to get up and ready.

### On the Day:

- Start your first day with a good breakfast and leave the house ready to arrive at school by 8.15am.
- When you arrive, head up the main drive and follow the path. Here you will find the Transition Team and the Wellbeing Team. Make a meeting place with your parent or guardian for the end of the day if they are picking you up.
- You will have a welcome assembly with your year group in the Student Centre, before spending the rest of the morning with your Period 1 teacher.
- Your Period 1 teacher will take you on a tour of the school to allow you to become more familiar with where everything is.
- You will be given your timetable and there will be plenty of people around to point you in the right direction.
- Remember to keep smiling! Everyone else is in the same boat as you and will feel just as nervous.
- On your first day you will have 5 lessons before the school day finishes at 2:30pm.





**It is a great idea to get prepared the night before as you are more likely to forget things when you are rushing around in the morning. In your school bag, day one, you should have:**

- Your pencil case with a ruler, rubber, sharpener, blue pens, black pens, lead pencil
- Blank A4 exercise books (x5)
- Lunch
- Water bottle
- School hat (given on the first day)
- Bring your laptop, fully charged. There are time slots available in the first week for each class to work with the IT officer to set you up on our school's platform.

# Appearance Policy

At Elanora State High School you must adhere to the uniform policy stated in our student code of conduct.

You must:

- wear full leather black shoes with white socks above the ankle bone
- no jewellery
- no face piercings
- no false eyelashes or false finger nails

Our formal uniform is worn Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, our sport uniform can be worn all day on Wednesday and house shirts can be worn on Fridays. Please make sure you have the correct, full black leather shoes for all school days.

Sports uniform is also needed for your PE lesson. You are to change into this uniform before your lesson. Teachers will give you plenty of time to do this. You are not to wear your PE uniform to school on non sport days.

## Bring Your Own Device **BYOD**

Elanora State High school is a BYOD school. You are required to provide your own device for your schooling.

Our full device specifications can be found on our website under the curriculum tab.

Please note that Chromebooks or iPads **are not compatible** with our BYOD infrastructure.

**How do you connect to the ESHS Intranet platform?**

During your first week of high school, each class has designated timeslots to work with the IT officer in setting up your laptop.

Please note for new BYOD's they **MUST already have been opened and setup** prior to being connected to the schools network, students whose device is not set up will be unable to access the schools network.

If you are unsure how to do this please visit the store you purchased from or ensure you do this at time of purchase.

## Mobile Phone Policy

Mobile phones are to be kept turned off in your lockers or bag as you arrive at school and only taken out at the end of the school day.

Mobile phones are not to be taken out of your locker or bag during break or lunch times.

Students found using their mobile phones during school time will have them confiscated and will need to hand it in to Student Services. You will receive an automatic detention.

If you need to make a call to anyone during the school day, report to Student Services or The Wellbeing Hub and ask to use the school phone.

There are several 'phone zones' in the school, where students can use their phone to pay for specific items. A 'phone zone' can be found at the tuck shop and financial services window. Once the student has paid for the item, they are to put their phones away.



# School Communication

## What happens if I need to leave school early?

If your child needs to leave early, your child must report to Student Services prior to the start of school and obtain a leave pass for an early departure.

Calling the school for students to be sent to the Administration is for emergency situations only.

## What happens if I am late to school?

If your child needs to sign in late, they need to report to Student Services with a note for explained absence and obtain a late note.

From there you will make your way to your time tabled lesson.

# Frequently Asked Questions

## What happens if I get lost?

You will all be taken on a tour during our Transition Day on the 8th December, as well as your first official day in 2026. Our school's program in Week 1 of 2026 is called 'O' Week. It's a full week dedicated to orientation for our new Year 7s.

If you find yourself not knowing where your next class is, go to Student Services and they will point you in the right direction. We understand that your first couple of weeks will be tricky, there are lots of people around to help.

## Where do I sit and eat lunch?

Year 7 have their own special designated area. This is located at the front of the The Hub. This is where all Year 7 students will meet at break time to eat and sit with their new peers, making it easy to catch up with friends who may not be in your class. Year 7 can go anywhere in the school if they wish, but no other year level is allowed to enter the Year 7 area.

## How will I make new friends?

Making new friends can feel daunting, especially if you are coming to high school not knowing anyone. Elanora has a lot of support in place to help you transition into your new role of being a high school student.

## Where do I put my school bag?

In primary school, you would have had a hook or bag rack to put your school bag on for the entire day. At high school, you need to carry your school bag around all day. When you are in class, your teacher will tell you where you need to keep your bag. You need to take your bag to each lesson, and carry your bag at break time. Your bag is your responsibility.

## What subjects are studied in high school?

In Year 7, your core classes consist of English, Maths, Science and Humanities. You will also study one elective subject each term across Year 7 and 8. This ensures that students are exposed to all the subjects that are available and they then can make an informed decision about what elective they would like to pursue in Years 9 and beyond.

# Frequently Asked Questions

## How much Homework will I have in high school?

Managing homework is easy – it just involves writing your tasks down in your school diary and being organised. Your teacher may also assign homework on our digital platform known as QLEARN. It will alert you if you have a task due. Teachers work hard to make sure that homework does not exceed an hour a night in Year 7.

## What happens if I am having a bad day and want to talk to someone?

We have a Wellbeing Hub where staff that can help are located. They can help you if you have concerns at school, with peers, or personal matters. You will be shown where it is located during your orientation tour. You will also see posters displayed around the school that provide information about how you can access support from the Wellbeing Hub.

## How do I order lunch at the canteen?

There are two ways you can order your lunch at our canteen. You can line up and choose from the hot and cold foods on display and pay using cash or card (in our phone zone), or you can order through Munch Monitor. This account is super easy to set up, just head to our school website for details.

## When do I get my locker?

Students in year 7 are automatically given a locker as part of their BYOD agreement. During your first week of high school, you are given a HIRER LOCKER AGREEMENT form which needs to be signed by a parent or guardian and returned to school. From there, as part of your orientation program, you are shown where and how to use your locker.

## What happens if I experience or see something I don't like?

Stymie empowers young people to ask for help when they need support, or if they are seeing or experiencing harm.

Stymie provides online reporting for schools. Encrypted, anonymous notifications are delivered within seconds to authorised recipients, who respond according to their wellbeing framework. The notification provides the option to include screen shots or images that validate the notification.

Our purpose is to support psychological safety by empowering young people with the self-belief that they can #saysomething on behalf of themselves or as a bystander for someone else.
